## Provincial Coinage



1. 1861 New Brunswick 1/2¢ ICCS VF-30 [XPR 833]  
A lovely example of a scarce one-year issue. These were made accidentally and were likely ordered alongside the Nova Scotia 1/2¢ and then shipped to Halifax; the error was soon discovered, and most of the New Brunswick half cents were swiftly recalled and melted.<sup>1</sup> This piece is in a better state of preservation than average for the grade, an excellent piece for the avid type collector of provincial coinage.

2. 1861 New Brunswick 1¢ ICCS AU-50 [XMV 863]  
Just shy of being mint state, with plenty of sharp detail remaining.

3. 1880 Newfoundland 1¢ NGC Fine Details Narrow 0; Surface Hairlines [2794147-005]  
The scarcer 'Narrow 0' variety for this year; appears to have had an old cleaning several years ago but presents nicely for the grade.

4. 1941C Newfoundland 1¢ PCI MS-64 Red & Brown [215446009]  
A bright uncirculated red and brown example, housed in a "Professional Coin Imaging" (PCI) holder; viewing is recommended.

5. 1941C Newfoundland 1¢ PCI MS-64 Red & Brown [215970008]  
Another brilliant uncirculated example certified by PCI; minor chip in the holder on the reverse side (not on the coin), viewing is recommended.

6. 1942 Newfoundland 1¢ PCI MS-63 Red & Brown [215970011]  
Lustrous and uncirculated with shocks of electric-blue toning throughout the reverse. Certified by PCI; viewing is recommended.

7. 1943C Newfoundland 1¢ ICCS MS-63 Red [XKJ 011]  
Full red, a bright and flashy example with reverse fields that are virtually proof-like.  
Start: \$40 ..... Estimate: \$100-\$125



8. 1940 Newfoundland 10¢ PCGS AU-55 (Re-engraved Date) [26294861]  
Scarce variety, not noted on the holder but clearly shows a re-engraved '1940' as well as 'CENTS' on the reverse.

9. 1941C Newfoundland 10¢ PCGS MS-65 [50786569]  
A lovely gem with excellent eye appeal, this piece features an excellent strike that pairs nicely with the array of autumnal toning.

10. 1899 Newfoundland 20¢ ICCS VF-30 Hook 9's [XUK 851]  
Scarcer variety with hooked '9's in the reverse date's lettering; lightly circulated, a nice piece for completing a set.

11. 1918C Newfoundland 50¢ ICCS AU-58 [XCI 600]  
Just shy of being uncirculated with minor traces of wear on the high points and some remaining luster.

12. 1882H Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-64 Obverse 1; Red & Brown [XDZ 168]  
Choice uncirculated with splashes of watermelon green toning mixed with vermilion, lustrous and well-struck with good eye appeal.  
Start: \$300 ..... Estimate: \$500-\$600

13. 1903 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-64 Lustrous Brown [XDZ 169]  
A sharp piece with lustrous brown surfaces, within which are hidden steel-blue tones and hints of gold throughout the obverse.

14. 1908 Canada 1¢ ICCS SP-64 Red [HL 874]  
 Choice uncirculated, a bright red specimen with the original mint lacquer intact. This example is well-struck with eye appeal that is well above average for the grade; the embossed two-letter ICCS tag is icing on the cake for such a scarce issue.

15. 1916 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-65 Red [47069923]  
 A brilliant gem example, fully lustrous with blazing red surfaces, a superior strike, and outstanding eye appeal. One of the nicer gems we have seen for the series, a worthy MS-65 Red for registry set collectors.

16. 1918 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-64 Red & Brown [6213124-001]  
 Choice uncirculated with a lively appearance, bright and lustrous with an above-average strike.

17. 1927 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-64 Brown [51299203]  
 A better example of a somewhat scarcer date, choice uncirculated with a good strike and cartwheel luster.

18. 1931 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-64 Red & Brown [49860280]  
 Nice original example, the obverse red and brown with some woodgrain toning, while the reverse is trace red with a bit of purple coloration hidden in the brown toning.

19. 1935 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-64 Brown [47315789]  
 A nice example, very near gem with a strong strike and lustrous olive toning.

 Gem, fully lustrous and bright red with an excellent strike.

21. 1938 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-64 Red; CNAS Silver (Ex Blay) [19347098]  
Fully lustrous with intense brightness, a superior example for the grade with a rich blend of copper hues ranging from light copper to fiery orange. Formerly in the collection of Stewart Blay, a numismatist and sculptor from New York known for assembling some of the finest registry sets for both American and Canadian small cents.<sup>2</sup>

22. 1938 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [VB 340]  
100% full red gem, bright and lustrous with a good strike.

A bright red gem, fully lustrous; housed in a two-letter holder.

24. 1940 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-66 Red [XJW 883]  
Superb gem with brilliant red surfaces and good eye appeal. Considerably more difficult to find than an MS-65 for this year, a fantastic piece for small cent collectors.

25. 1943 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-64 Red [XJV 018]  
Choice uncirculated with lustrous red surfaces.

26. 1943 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [XJV 023]  
Fully lustrous gem with deep wine-red surfaces and an excellent strike, believed to have been sourced from an original roll.

27. 1944 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-64 Red & Brown [47130903]  
Brilliant and uncirculated with an excellent strike and ethereal tones of green/gold.

28. 1944 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-64 Red & Brown [49860283]  
A stunning piece, fully lustrous with an above-average strike and shocking tones of electric green covering the reverse.

Choice uncirculated, a lustrous red example of a scarce year.

30. 1944 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-65 Brown [44670639]

A sharp example, fully lustrous with bold blueberry toning throughout. Tilting the coin reveals a near perfect cartwheel luster, which helps to draw attention to the exceptional toning. This piece wins points for strong eye appeal and carries a significant weighting for registry set collectors of both George VI small cents and 1944-year sets.

31. 1946 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [AQ 207]

Lustrous and gem with an above-average strike and deep wine-red surfaces. The rims of this piece are defined well with all denticles visible on both sides, and the eye appeal is excellent with no distracting flaws, a difficult combination to find on any 1946 cent. Housed in an older ICCS flip with an embossed tag. Expect a strong premium when bidding on this piece, as similar 1946 cents that have surfaced recently in various auctions have been selling for multiples of the MS-65 Red trend value listed in Canadian Coin News.

32. 1947 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-63 Red & Brown [47167674]

A stunning example for toned cent collectors, with a mix of light greens on the obverse and vibrant electric purple tones on the reverse.

33. 1947 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-64 Red [XWW 007]

Bright, lustrous, and red, a good example for the grade.

A brilliant gem, bright and lustrous with a good strike; housed in an embossed holder.

 Boldy struck with sharp rims, a choice example of this low-mintage specimen.

 Brilliant and red, choice uncirculated; in a two-letter holder.

 A stunning 100% red gem, fully lustrous with no distracting marks on the devices or fields whatsoever, perhaps the nicest MS-65 Red we have seen for the year.

38. 1951 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [XYS 403]  
 Gem example, red and lustrous with an above-average strike.

 Gem, red and lustrous with a bit of toning in the peripheral areas.

40. 1954 Canada 1¢ PCGS PL-65+ Strap (SF); Red; CAM [48793506]  
 A flashy proof-like example, fully lustrous with strong cameo on both the obverse and reverse.

41. 1955 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 SF; Red [XLH 073]  
 Gem, lustrous and red with an excellent strike.

42. 1957 Canada 1¢ PCGS PL-66 Red & Brown [11900530]  
 Superb gem and well-struck with a colorful array of purple and blue throughout; obverse has nice cameo where the cameo itself has toned blue.

43. 1957 Canada 1¢ PCGS PL-66 Red [2625084]  
 Brilliant and mirror-like, a superb gem with fresh red surfaces and outstanding eye appeal; housed in an old green holder (OGH).

44. 1958 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Hanging 8; Red [XJI 681]  
 A bright red gem, with cartwheel luster and a 'Hanging 8' die clash on the reverse.

45. 1959 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [XWW 024]  
A bright red gem, lustrous with a good strike.

Gem, flashy with bright red surfaces and heavy cameo on the obverse.

47. 1960 Canada 1¢ PCGS PL-65 Red [49085031]  
Gem, flashy with bright red surfaces and light cameo on the obverse.

48. 1983 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-66 Far Beads; Red [XDI 216]  
Superb gem uncirculated, fully lustrous with an excellent strike and bright red surfaces.

49. 1983 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-66 Near Beads; Red [XJW 885]  
The scarcer of the two known varieties, difficult to find as a superb gem; fully lustrous bright red surfaces and an above-average strike.

50. 1904 Canada 5¢ PCGS MS-62 [54806606]  
Lustrous and well-struck with hues of blue, red, and yellow encircling a dusky olive background.

51. 1910 Canada 5¢ ICCS MS-62 Pointed Leaves [XKV 106]  
Uncirculated, fully lustrous with fresh matte surfaces and strong eye appeal for the grade.

52. 1922 Canada 5¢ ICCS MS-64 [XXZ 516]  
Choice uncirculated with brilliant pinwheel luster; strike is above average, with all eight crown beads visible.

53. 1925 Canada 5¢ ICCS VF-30 [XFB 845]  
The key date of the George V nickel series, a nice problem-free example of this low-mintage year.

54. 1937 Canada 5¢ PCGS MS-66 [51299219]

Currently tied for finest graded at PCGS, this piece is in an extraordinary state of preservation. While the strike and luster are somewhat average for the type, the surfaces are practically flawless with no distracting marks whatsoever. Significantly more difficult to obtain in MS-66 versus MS-65, and a prized piece for registry set collectors given the limited number of opportunities to acquire such an example.

55. 1938 Canada 5¢ NGC MS-62 [1910470-008]

Uncirculated, a good piece for a date or type set.

Choice uncirculated with an average strike, a nice example.

Choice uncirculated, lustrous with a good strike; housed in a two-letter holder.

Choice uncirculated, a toned example with some underlying luster; well-struck with very few marks for the grade assigned.

59. 1942 Canada 5¢ ICCS MS-65 Tombac [XRS 713]

A gem example of the tombac variety, well-struck with lustrous golden surfaces. The rims are particularly sharp for the issue, a desirable example as such.

60. 1943 Canada 5¢ PCGS MS-64 Tombac [45191615]

Choice uncirculated with brilliant luster and an excellent strike, a nice bright example.

A well-struck piece, fully lustrous with light variations of caramel toning over brilliant golden surfaces.

62. 1945 Canada 5¢ ICCS MS-64 [XLY 537]  
Choice uncirculated, a nice example for a year or type set.

A classic example in gem, fully lustrous and well-struck.

64. 1946 Canada 5¢ PCGS MS-64 [59823049]  
Choice uncirculated with brilliant luster and fields that are nearly reflective; there is a light fingerprint along the bottom of the obverse, a minor distraction considering the luster and exceptional strike.

65. 1948 Canada 5¢ ICCS MS-64 [XVE 879]  
Choice uncirculated, lustrous with good eye appeal.

66. 1949 Canada 5¢ NGC MS-66 [6511578-020]  
Boldly struck with well-defined details and lustrous surfaces; viewing is recommended.

67. 1951 Canada 5¢ ICCS MS-65 Commemorative [XKJ 067]  
A nice gem example of this popular commemorative issue, well-struck and fully lustrous.

68. 1953 Canada 5¢ ICCS MS-65 NSF FL [XQJ 710]  
Gem with brilliant surfaces and an excellent strike.

A superb gem with a strong strike, exceptional luster, and cameo on both the obverse and reverse.

70. Lot of (x30) 1942 Canada 5¢ UNC Tombac  
Group of thirty (x30) 1942 Canada 5¢ Tombac, all uncirculated and lustrous with grades ranging between MS-60 and MS-63.

71. Lot of (x3) Canada 5¢; 1954 ICCS MS-64 SF, 1956 PCGS PL-64, 1967 ICCS MS-63 Rotated Die  
Group of three (x3) Canada 5¢, all choice uncirculated and third-party graded.

72. 1908 Canada 10¢ ICCS SP-64 [XDQ 467]  
A boldly struck example with deep lustrous toning and good eye appeal. Close examination reveals sharply scalloped rims and strongly hammered letters, though the details on the high points of the king's portrait are not quite as strong and are more suggestive of a circulation strike. An intriguing piece worthy of closer examination and more thorough research.

73. 1910 Canada 10¢ ICCS MS-63 [XJW 888]  
Lustrous and bright, with matte surfaces and a near "reverse proof" finish on the obverse. Silver coinage from 1910 with this finish type bears a resemblance to the specimen issues from 1908, with a slightly brilliant relief contrasted against frosty matte fields. While there has been some speculation that coins with this finish were struck for individual sale – as an explanation for the appearance that is between mint state and specimen – we are more inclined to believe that these coins were struck as a result of the Mint's experimentation with different die preparation techniques during the later years of Edward VII coinage.

74. 1936 Canada 10¢ PCGS MS-65 CNAS Silver [31741433]  
A bright original gem with a kaleidoscope of colors on the obverse and beautiful peripheral tones on the reverse, the likely result of spending many years in an album to achieve such rich coloration. CNAS sticker (Silver) on the holder.

75. 1939 Canada 10¢ ICCS MS-65 [XDG 806]  
Gem, richly toned with a mixture of burgundy and gold throughout and a blending of dark olive, blue, and purple around the perimeter.

76. 1941 Canada 10¢ ICCS MS-64 [XXZ 519]  
Choice uncirculated, bright and lustrous with tinges of light magenta in the peripheral areas. Though not noted on the holder, this example clearly displays a fully doubled '1941' on the reverse (machine doubling).

77. 1944 Canada 10¢ ICCS MS-62 [RM 931]  
Brilliant and uncirculated, a good piece to fill out a starter collection.

78. 1945 Canada 10¢ PCGS MS-65 [39177681]  
Lustrous and well-struck with exceptional toning, the surfaces displaying a mix of fall colors throughout.

79. 1946 Canada 10¢ ICCS MS-64 [XJV 068]  
Fully lustrous and blast white with strong die polish lines in the fields; accompanied with the original 2x2 holder with Bob Armstrong's writing.

80. 1947 Canada 10¢ PCGS MS-65 [56996922]  
A sharp gem, well-struck with brilliant pinwheel luster and light copper-gold tones throughout, an ideal piece for a George VI dime set.

81. 1950 Canada 10¢ ICCS MS-64 [XXZ 474]  
Choice uncirculated, blast white and lustrous with a sharp strike and excellent eye appeal for the grade.

82. 1951 Canada 10¢ ANACS MS-66 [5302475]  
A lustrous gem example, well-struck with deep sea green surfaces accentuated by hints of blue and golden-brown toning; fantastic eye appeal.

83. 1951 Canada 10¢ PCGS MS-66 [49860302]  
Another brilliant example in this lofty grade, toned with shades of burgundy and hints of gold, yellow, and green throughout, fully lustrous with splendid eye appeal.

84. 1952 Canada 10¢ ICCS MS-65 [XWZ 227]  
Gem, a nice lustrous example with a good strike and soft pastel toning.

Currently tied for finest graded at PCGS, this dime is an exceptional piece in every way: it is both fully lustrous with an above-average strike and has excellent eye appeal owing largely to the soft blend of autumnal colors in the toning. A fantastic opportunity for registry set collectors seeking to add a superior example to their collections.

A brilliant proof-like gem, white with reflective fields and strong cameo on the obverse.

87. 1955 Canada 10¢ ICCS MS-65 Victoria North; Heavy Cameo [TY 757]  
A frosty white gem, fully lustrous with an above-average strike and heavy cameo on the obverse portrait. Pedigreed to the Victoria North collection on the ICCS holder.<sup>3</sup>

88. 1956 Canada 10¢ ICCS MS-65 [XWZ 229]  
Gem, lustrous with a good strike.

We strongly consider this piece to be one of the finest surviving George V 25¢ that one could possibly obtain, and we doubt that a nicer 1932 quarter in terms of overall quality will ever surface. Those familiar with the 1973 Large Bust quarter know that a limited number managed to escape the Mint after being struck with the obverse of the 1972 25¢; these quarters featured a larger portrait of Queen Elizabeth II with beads closer to the rim compared to the revised Small Bust variety. This variety can be readily obtained in higher grades in both specimen (SP) and proof-like (PL) as those strikes were issued as part of non-circulating sets. Business strikes of this variety are far scarcer in better grades; they are often regarded as scarce in mint state and are very scarce in MS-63 or higher. Examples graded MS-65 are quite rare, with the 2015 ICCS Population Report showing none graded above MS-65 at that time. This example, graded MS-66, is a prized rarity for quarter collectors; we believe that this is the first auction appearance of a 1973 Large Bust in this condition, a fully lustrous piece with an exceptional strike and virtually free of contact. We anticipate strong bidding and look forward to watching it set what will likely be a new auction record.

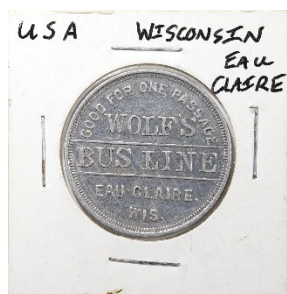

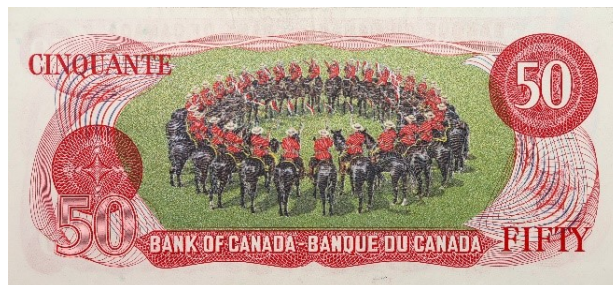
