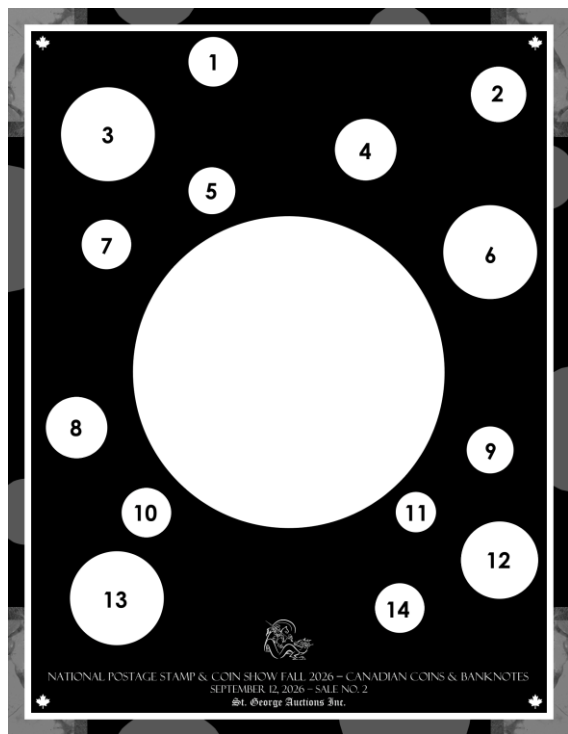
Welcome to our Fall 2026 Auction!

We are excited to be the Official Auctioneer this fall for the National Postage Stamp & Coin Show in Mississauga, Ontario! This auction is our second annual fall sale, representing just over 300 lots from multiple consignors across Canada, with a wide range of high-quality Canadian coins and banknotes to be presented live on September 12, 2025, at 6:00 PM EDT, through iCollector.com.

In the process of assembling lots for this auction, three themes of Canadian coinage became readily apparent: small cents, especially high-grade George VI examples; pieces with incredible toning ranging from choice to superb gem condition; and an impressive range of uncirculated pieces with exceptional cameo. Several of the George VI cents being offered are in gem condition, five of which are represented by superb gem examples, a 1937 Matte ICCS SP-67 Red followed by three ICCS MS-66 Red (1940, 1949 A Off Denticle, and 1952) and a 1947 PCGS MS-66 Red (Ex Blay). A variety of toned pieces offered in this sale are, in terms of their color and striking appearance, beyond exceptional, the 1953 10¢ PCGS MS-66 No Strap, 1949 25¢ ICCS MS-64, and 1952 25¢ ICCS MS-64 Low Relief; Double HP being three such examples. The list of pieces with unusually strong cameo is far too long to fully exhaust here, though pieces such as the 1952 \$1 ICCS MS-63 WL; Heavy Cameo and the 1958 \$1 PCGS PL-67 CAM will have no problem drawing your attention as you read through this catalogue.

Of course, some other high-end rarities continue to grab the spotlight due to their exceptional eye appeal, condition, and scarcity: the 1936 50¢ PCGS MS-64 (Ex Victoria Collection) and 1955 \$1 PCGS PL-67 Arnprior being particularly noteworthy pieces worthy of placement in high-grade registry sets.

Whether you are a collector, dealer, or a little bit of both, we hope that you will find something of interest to you in this auction. Good luck!

1. 1941C Newfoundland 1¢ PCGS MS-63 Brown [47315799]
Choice uncirculated, nicely toned with various shades of blue throughout; bright and lustrous with good eye appeal.
Start: \$40 Estimate: \$120-\$150



2. 1943C Newfoundland 1¢ ICCS MS-62 Red [ZZ 879]
A bright uncirculated example, with vibrant neon tones of gold, purple, and blue throughout. Housed in an older two-letter ICCS flip with an embossed tag.

3. 1943C Newfoundland 1¢ ICCS MS-63 Red & Brown [QN 535]
Choice uncirculated, a nice toned example with deep underlying luster.

4. 1859 Canada 1¢ ICCS G-6 Wide 9/8 (Cleaned) [XRC 058]
An affordable example of this scarce variety, in which a wide '9' was repunched over the last '8' on a repurposed 1858 reverse die; appears to have had an old cleaning.

5. 1899 Canada 1¢ ICCS AU-50 Repunched Last 9 [XKI 419]
A good example of this variety, lightly circulated and problem-free.

6. 1914 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-62 Trace Red [HL 002]
Lustrous and uncirculated with woodgrain toning in the obverse fields. Housed in an older two-letter ICCS flip with an embossed tag.

7. 1929 Canada 1¢ ICCS VF-30 High 9 [XOE 834]
A nice example of the 1929 High 9 variety, where the last '9' in '1929' is a bit higher than usual (the result of hand-punched dies).

8. 1929 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-63 Red [QT 157]
Choice uncirculated, lustrous with a good strike. Housed in an older two-letter ICCS flip with an embossed tag.

9. 1930 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-63 Red & Brown [51299205]
Choice uncirculated, a nice red & brown example of a tougher date.

10. 1935 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-64 Red & Brown [XKI 784]
An excellent red & brown piece, choice uncirculated with good luster and traces of gold and purple tones throughout.

11. 1935 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-64 Red [XBR 555]
Well-struck and lustrous, a choice example with lots of red remaining.

12. 1936 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-64 Red & Brown [XBR 564]
Choice uncirculated, very well-struck with traces of red contrasting nicely against the light brown toning.

13. 1936 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-64 Red [XKI 420]
A bright red example, choice uncirculated with lovely golden tones throughout.

14. 1937 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-65 Red [21590244]
A brilliant red gem, fully lustrous with a strong strike and superb eye appeal; an above-average example for the grade.

15. 1937 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-65 Red (Ex Blay) [19347121]
Another brilliant red gem example of the 1937 cent, this one being attributable to the Stewart Blay Collection of Canadian Cents that were sold in the fall of 2023.¹ This piece is exceptionally well-struck and displays various shades of red, a trait seen on several of Blay's early George VI cents. Fully lustrous with good eye appeal, with only the slightest trace of a fingerprint on the reverse to note.

16. 1937 Canada 1¢ ICCS SP-67 Matte; Red [XMZ 614]

A superb gem example of the 1937 matte specimen cent, bright red and fully lustrous with no distracting marks whatsoever. As with most 1937 matte specimens, this piece displays fine die polish lines in the fields and has a rather satin-like finish overall; paired with a very strong strike, the eye appeal of this piece is rivaled only by a few other examples in superb gem grades. We know of no finer examples graded by ICCS, the ideal piece for the discerning specimen collector.

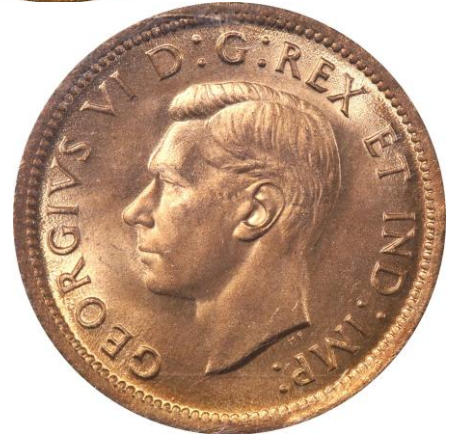
17. 1938 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-64 Red & Brown (Ex Blay) [XJZ 962]
Choice uncirculated with a range of fiery red tones, the obverse being especially lustrous. This example can be traced to the Stewart Blay collection, where it was previously graded MS-64 Red by PCGS.²

18. 1938 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [GC 139]
A 100% full red gem, exceptionally bright and lustrous with zero spots or fingerprints whatsoever; a fresh example that looks as if it were struck yesterday. Housed in an older two-letter ICCS flip with an embossed tag.

19. 1939 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [MD 900]
Gem, bright and lustrous with a good strike (two-letter ICCS flip).

20. 1940 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-66 Red [XYH 476]
A 100% scorching red gem, fully lustrous with an above-average strike and exceptional eye appeal. The surfaces of this piece are essentially flawless, with no distracting marks in either the fields or the devices. Fully worthy of its superb gem grade, one of the best examples we have seen for this year.

Choice uncirculated, lustrous with a bit of light toning; strike is above average for the year.

22. 1941 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-65 Red [40010331]

A fiery red gem, fully lustrous with a superior strike and fantastic eye appeal. Both sides display pinwheel luster and rich red surfaces, and all rim denticles are present and accounted for (these and the high points of the larger leaf on the reverse are notorious for being softly struck on 1941 and 1942 cents). A worth addition to a set of George VI 1¢ for registry collectors.

23. 1942 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-64 Red [35035452]

Choice uncirculated, bright and red with excellent luster.

24. 1944 Canada 1¢ CCCS MS-63 Lustrous Brown [0006736]

A choice example, lustrous and well-struck with hints of gold throughout the surface's moss green toning.

25. 1944 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-64 Brown [56804695]

A stunning lustrous brown example, choice uncirculated with an excellent strike and fantastic eye appeal. Both sides display a vibrant mix of green and purples tones which appear all the more lively under strong lighting.

26. 1945 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-64 Red [72216121]

Brilliant and red, a lustrous choice example with a sharp strike; obverse fields are a bit reflective.

27. 1945 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [XUU 210]

Scarce in gem, a bright wine-red example with lustrous surfaces and a strong strike is a tough combination for this year; worthy of a premium bid.

28. 1946 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [ER 958]
A bright red gem, lustrous and well-struck with good eye appeal (two-letter ICCS flip).

29. 1947 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [YR 349]
Gem, lustrous and red with very light purple toning in the peripheral areas.
Start: \$20 Estimate: \$50-\$75



30. 1947 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-66 Red (Ex Blay) [05682131]
A fiery 100% red gem with a superior strike, this piece is fully lustrous and tied for finest graded at PCGS (5/0), presenting an important opportunity for registry set collectors across multiple sets. Formerly in the collection of Stewart Blay, with the pedigree (Blay) noted on the holder.³ The opportunities to acquire such an exceptional example are slim; expect bidding to be as competitive as the coin is brilliant (very!).

31. 1947 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 ML; Red (Pointed 7) [BR 032]
A brilliant gem example of the maple leaf variety, struck in 1948 with a small maple leaf after the date as the mint awaited new obverse dies that omitted "ET IND:IMP", or "and Emperor of India", as India gained its independence in 1947. This example is fully lustrous and well-struck, an ideal example for the type. While not noted on the older two-letter ICCS flip, this piece is the "Pointed 7" variety.

32. 1947 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 ML; Blunt 7; Red [HI 520]
Another brilliant gem, also displaying a small maple leaf after the date to denote being struck in 1948, except this is the scarcer of the two varieties with a blunt '7' in '1947'. Lustrous and red with a good strike, an ideal example of this scarce variety for small cent collectors.

33. 1948 Canada 1¢ PCGS MS-64 Red; A Between Denticles (Ex Blay) [60057991]
Choice uncirculated, with brilliant red surfaces and an excellent strike. From the collection of Stewart Blay.⁴

Bright and red, a sharp choice example with good eye appeal.

Gem, a nice red example of the 'A Off Denticle' variety; fully lustrous and red with a good strike.

37. 1949 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-66 A Off Denticle; Red [XGN 161]
Our fourth offering of this year and variety in this auction, this one in superb gem. Fully lustrous and 100% red, with a strong strike and nearly flawless surfaces, the ideal piece for small cent collectors.

38. 1950 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [XGS 873]
Gem, a lustrous red example with an excellent strike.

39. 1951 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [XLW 759]
A bright red gem, lustrous with a good strike.

40. 1952 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-64 Red & Brown [XLO 168]
Choice uncirculated, with a lustrous red obverse and a more toned reverse.

41. 1952 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Red [XGS 867]
A 100% red gem, fully lustrous and well-struck, a fantastic example for the grade.

42. 1952 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-66 Red [XGN 195]
Superb gem; fully lustrous and 95%+ red with an above-average strike; a tough grade for this last year of the George VI series.

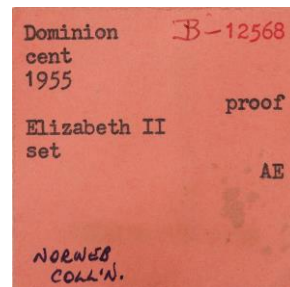
43. 1954 Canada 1¢ NGC PL-66 Shoulder Fold; Red [2831893-002]
Superb gem, a brilliant flashy proof-like with full red surfaces and a razor-sharp strike.

44. 1954 Canada 1¢ PCGS PL-66 Strap; Red [46723018]
Another brilliant example of the 1954 proof-like cent in superb gem, 100% red with mirror-like fields and an equally razor-sharp strike.

45. 1955 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 SF; Small Denticles (Red) [XWW 018]
100% red gem example of the Small Denticles variety, well-struck with brilliant pinwheel luster.

46. 1955 Canada 1¢ ICCS PL-66 SF; Red; UHC (Ex Norweb) [XCV 142]
A 100% red superb gem proof-like, fully lustrous with a bold strike and ultra heavy cameo on both the obverse and reverse. Proof-like cents of such superior quality are rare gems indeed, this one boasting both technical superiority and an impressive provenance, originating from the famous Norweb collection. Comes paired with its original envelope from the Norweb sale.⁵

47. 1957 Canada 1¢ PCGS PL-66 Red [15538850]
Super gem proof-like, 100% red with brilliant mirror-like surfaces and an excellent strike.
Start: \$10 Estimate: \$30-\$50



48. 1957 Canada 1¢ NGC PL-67 Red [3494860-012]
Another superb gem proof-like, also 100% red and fully lustrous; bright and reflective with a superior strike. Among the finest graded by NGC (12/1).

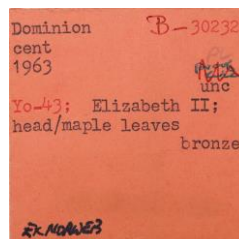
49. 1958 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-64 Red; Heavy Cameo [XJW 305]
Choice uncirculated, fully lustrous and 100% red with strong cameo on the obverse.
Start: \$5 Estimate: \$20-\$25



50. 1959 Canada 1¢ ICCS PL-67 Red; UHC [XXQ 806]
A stellar superb gem proof-like, fully lustrous with bright 100% red surfaces and strong obverse cameo; both the strike and eye appeal are superior, essentially a flawless example.

51. 1962 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-63 Hanging 2; Red; Cameo [IL 758]
A choice example, lustrous with obverse cameo and a 'Hanging 2' die clash on the reverse; obverse is reflective though somewhat muted from a few fingerprints.

52. 1963 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-65 Hanging 3; Red [XGN 002]
Gem, lustrous and well-struck with bright red surfaces and light cameo on both sides.

53. 1963 Canada 1¢ ICCS PL-67 Red; UHC (Ex Norweb) [XCV 141]
Another superb gem from the famous Norweb collection, 100% red and fully lustrous with an excellent strike and strong cameo on both the obverse and reverse. Comes paired with its original envelope from the Norweb sale.⁶

54. 1964 Canada 1¢ Error (Broadstruck); BU
A brilliant uncirculated example of a broadstruck 1964 cent, where the coin was struck out of collar.

55. 1965 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-64 LB P5; Red [XDL 585]
Choice uncirculated, 100% and fully lustrous with excellent eye appeal; a select example of the "Type 4" (or Large Beads, Pointed 5) variety.

56. 1966 Canada 1¢ PCGS PL-66 Red; CAM [48116381]
Superb gem proof-like, fully lustrous with heavy cameo on both the obverse and reverse.

57. 1977 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-67 Red [XWT 958]
100% red superb gem, boasting fully lustrous surfaces and a strong strike; the surfaces of this piece are remarkably clean with zero distractions whatsoever. Examples in MS-66 remain relatively easy to find given the availability of original rolls for this year, yet pieces in MS-67 remain quite elusive.

Superb gem, full red and lustrous; struck on a copper-plated zinc planchet.

Another superb gem, full red and lustrous; struck on a copper-plated zinc planchet.

60. 2012 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-66 Red (Non-Magnetic) [XZM 302]
A superb gem example from the cent's final year of issue, 100% red and fully lustrous; from an original roll, struck on a copper-plated zinc planchet.

61. 2012 Canada 1¢ ICCS MS-66 Red (Magnetic) [XZM 303]
Superb gem, 100% red and fully lustrous; from an original roll, struck on a copper-plated steel planchet.

62. 2012 Canada 1¢ ICCS PF-68 Silver; UHC; 2 Maple Leaves [XXF 200]
An immaculate example of this modern mint issue, struck in 99.99% pure silver and inspired by the small cent design used from 1920-1936. Lot is GST/HST exempt.

63. Partial Album 1¢, Includes 1922, 1923, 1924, 1925, 1926
An older blue Whitman album with a near-complete collection of Canadian small cents; years (though not all varieties) from 1920 through 1990 are preset, mostly in circulated grades.

64. 1871 Canada 5¢ ICCS MS-60 Cameo [XCZ 069]

An uncirculated example with blast-white surfaces and a solid strike, this piece displays excellent luster for the grade and exhibits light cameo on the obverse. While examination under a loupe reveals minor scuffs and hairlines that keep this piece from grading higher, these marks do not detract from the overall eye appeal when viewed without magnification. The cameo designation is a scarce attribute for Canadian coinage of the Victorian era and suggests this piece was struck shortly after a fresh pair of dies were introduced; overall, a scarce and intriguing example for cameo collectors.

65. 1885 Canada 5¢ ICCS F-12 Small 5/5 [XAT 438]

A nice circulated example of this scarce variety, with a clearly repunched '5' in '1885'.

Nice example for date collectors, circulated yet problem-free.

67. 1900 Canada 5¢ ICCS VF-30 Round 0 [XYU 942]

The scarcer of the two known varieties for the 1900 5¢ piece, where both zeros in '1900' are considerably rounder than the zeros in the more common 'Oval 0' counterpart; a great problem-free example for a type set.

68. 1915 Canada 5¢ ICCS EF-45 [XYH 102]

A nice lightly circulated example of a scarcer date, with some traces of luster still remaining.

A brilliant choice uncirculated example, well-struck and fully lustrous with excellent eye appeal.

70. 1922 Canada 5¢ ICCS MS-63 (Near Rim) [SE 062]
Choice uncirculated, a superior example for the grade, fully lustrous with an above-average strike; appears to be the 'Near Rim' variety where the 'S' in 'CENTS' is close to the reverse rim. Housed in an older two-letter ICCS flip with an embossed tag.

71. 1922 Canada 5¢ ICCS MS-64 (Far Rim) [XKI 800]
Another choice uncirculated example of the 1922 5¢, lustrous and well-struck; the first year for Canadian five-cent pieces to be struck in nickel. Consignor notes that this is the 'Far Rim' variety; we agree with this opinion.

72. 1925 Canada 5¢ ICCS VF-20 [XKX 549]
A nice circulated example of this key date, good for a type set of George V 5¢.

Choice uncirculated, a well-struck example with lustrous satin surfaces.

74. 1937 Canada 5¢ ICCS MS-65 [XKI 421]
A brilliant gem, fully lustrous with good eye appeal, an ideal addition to a gem collection of George VI 5¢ pieces.

75. 1938 Canada 5¢ ICCS MS-62 [XCR 623]
Uncirculated, a bright lustrous example; would make an excellent addition to either a date or type set.

76. 1942 Canada 5¢ MS-64 Tombac (Thames Valley Coins) [2025-049]
Choice uncirculated, a well-struck tombac example with bright golden surfaces.

Examining this coin from any angle showcases this piece's brilliance, with luster rolling effortlessly around the devices. The strike is superior in all regards where even the obverse rim appears perfectly scalloped due to the sharpness of the reeded edge. A few scattered field marks prevent this coin from crossing the technical threshold of MS-65, though this piece displays the qualities of a gem in terms of luster, strike, and eye appeal.

Regarding this coin's provenance: this piece was listed as Lot No. 4203 (p. 229) of the Victoria Collection, which was auctioned by Bowers and Morena (now Stack's Bowers) on September 13, 1989, as part of *The Kissel and Victoria Collections*. The pedigree "Victoria Collection" is noted on the label of the holder.

This piece is a worthwhile addition, if not a prize, to any collection of Canadian coinage seeking an example of a George V 50¢ that is choice in both condition and pedigree.

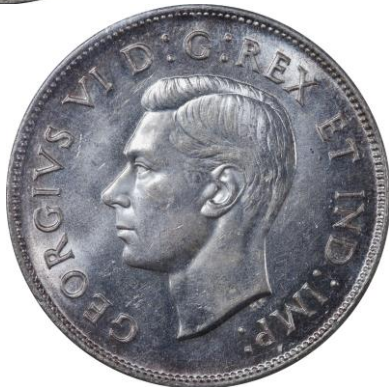

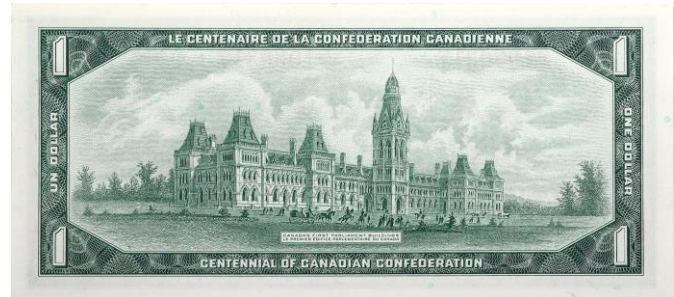
